Jacob's Move To Egypt

Chapter 46

The story so far...

- Joseph, the beloved of the father...
- Rejected by his brethren...
- Suffers, and is finally exalted...
- He takes a Gentile bride
- And holds the office of King & Priest...
- During a period of 7 years of 'trouble'
- His brethren cry out to him for help...
- They acknowledge their sin...
- And repent in their hour of need...
- Joseph become their saviour

The Revelation of Joseph

- He “made himself known to his brothers”
- When & why did he choose to do it?
- When he saw in them the “fruits of repentance”
- Repentance brings Restoration
- Restoration brings Revelation

The Revelation of Joseph

- Type and Shadow of Israel:
- Joseph was hidden from his brothers until they repented
- Jesus will be hidden from Israel until they repent
 - Zechariah 12:
 - “And I will pour upon the house of David, and upon the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the spirit of grace and of supplications: and they shall look upon me whom they have pierced, and they shall mourn for him, as one mourneth for his only son, and shall be in bitterness for him, as one that is in bitterness for his firstborn”.

The Revelation of Joseph

- After 22 years of separation he now desires to see his father
- Jacob will move the family down into Egypt in fulfilment of the prophetic promise given to Abraham...

God's Protection

¹⁵ And thou shalt go to thy fathers in peace; thou shalt be buried in a good old age.

¹⁶ But in the fourth generation they shall come hither again: for the iniquity of the Amorites is not yet full.

Gen 15:15-16

“Iniquity of the Amorites not yet full” ?

- They need to sin a bit more?
- God is giving them time to repent?
- The end of something is in sight:
 - the influx of the Nephilim would cease

Our Ready or God's Ready?

- We may think we are ready for the challenge...
- But God's timing is always perfect!
- Consider David
 - Was he ready to become king?
 - God would have him learn many more lessons before finally becoming king
- Consider Paul
 - His enthusiasm to preach the gospel nearly resulted in his premature death!
 - He had to be lowered over the wall in a basket and flee! (14 years later he was ready!)

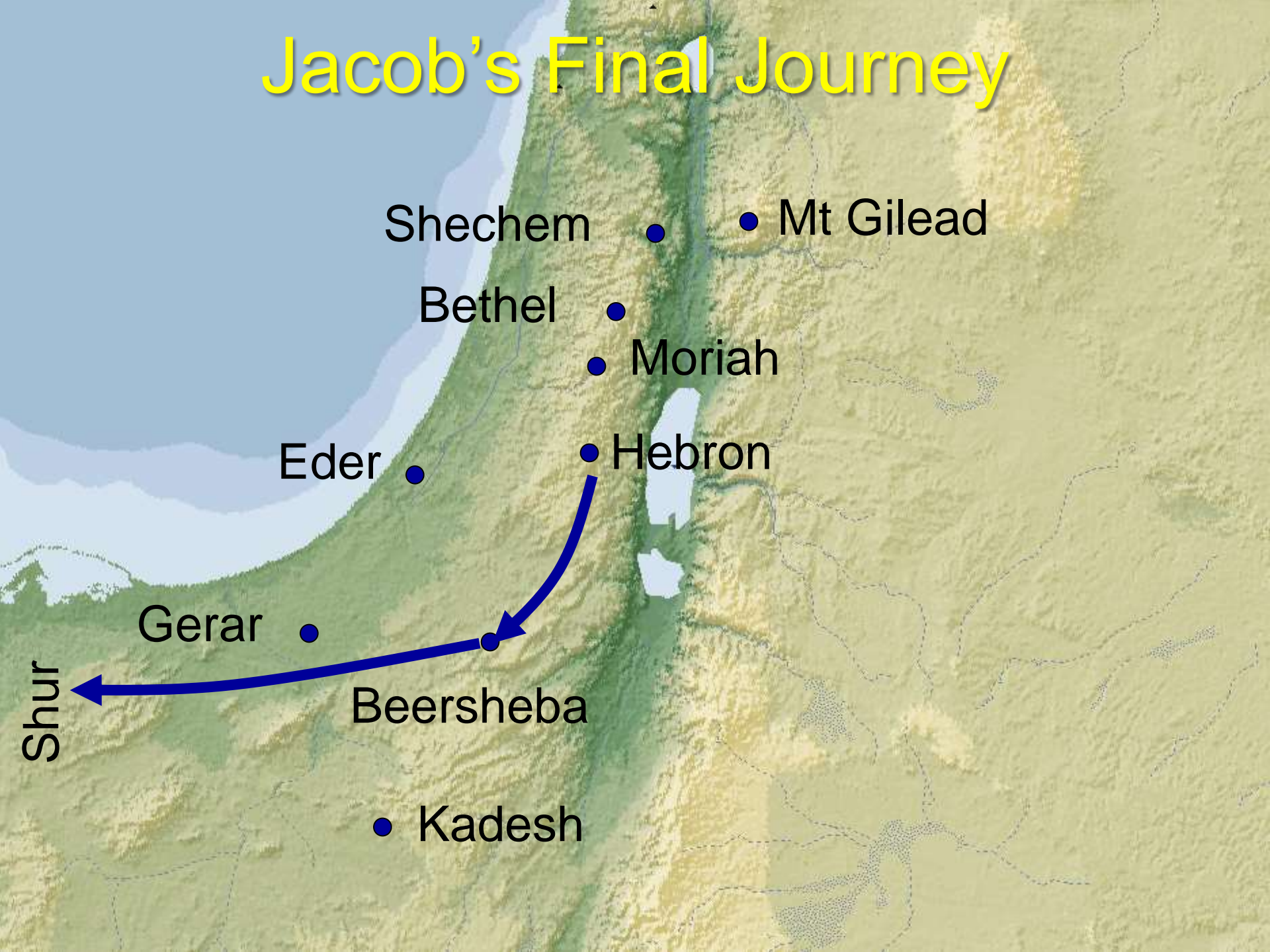

- Jacob was sent out from here by Isaac to journey to Padan Aram (Laban)
- Now Jacob returns one last time
- He is leaving the land of his fathers

Jacob's Fears?

- His father was told NOT to go down to Egypt - **Genesis 26:2**
- How can Jacob NOT have fear?
- The Knowledge of God will keep you from fear
 - **If you fear God you'll fear nothing else**
 - **Proverbs 3:19-26**

Genesis 46

- ² And God spake unto Israel in the visions of the night, and said, Jacob, Jacob. And he said, Here am I.
- ³ And he said, I am God, the God of thy father: fear not to go down into Egypt; for I will there make of thee a great nation:

Genesis 46

4 I will go down with thee into Egypt; and I will also surely bring thee up again: and Joseph shall put his hand upon thine eyes.

Jacob's Journey

- He has spent most of his life providing for himself
- Process of life vs. Purpose of Life
- Now God is going to make him a great nation
- Jacob has done nothing to “earn” this privilege...
- Now God has provided it

An Error?

- Critics try to claim we have an error in the text because we have 3 different numbers given of how many went down to Egypt.
- Here (v26) we are told 66
- Verse 27 gives us a total of 70
- In the NT Stephen (in Acts 7) gives us 75!

¹⁴ Then sent Joseph, and called his father Jacob to him, and all his kindred, threescore and fifteen souls.

An Error?

- Critics try to claim we have an error in the text because we have 3 different numbers given of how many went down to Egypt.
- Here (v26) we are told 66
- Verse 27 gives us a total of 70
- In the NT Stephen (in Acts 7) gives us 75!
 - *see also Exodus 1:5 and Deuteronomy 10:22 where we are also given 70.*

An Error?

- The common ‘scholarly’ approach to resolving this is to take the Septuagint translation
 - The Septuagint was a Greek translation of the Old Testament – purportedly translated from Hebrew into Greek around 270 BC by 70 Jewish scholars
- This actually has an additional 5 names not listed in the Genesis account
- ...thus reconciling it with Stephen’s statement in Acts 7

An Error?

- However, this inevitably leads to the conclusion that there must be an error in the Hebrew Masoretic text!
 - not only in Genesis 46:26-27, but also in Exodus 1:5 and Deuteronomy 10:22.
- These “missing five names” are recorded in 1 Chronicles 7:14-21, being Machir, the son of Manasseh, Machir’s son Gilead, Ephraim’s two sons, Tahan and Shuthelah, along with his son Eran.

An Error?

- However, if this were true, it means that Stephen was quoting from the Septuagint!
- *“Is it really reasonable or likely that Stephen (having been dragged in before the Sanhedrin by a mob and now in the middle of a Spirit-filled address before the very men who had caused the death of his Lord – while speaking as a Hebrew to the Hebrews) would have quoted from a GREEK Old Testament manuscript of Genesis in which five names had been added in violation of the Hebrew laws governing Scripture transmission? We trow not!*

An Error?

- *“Deuteronomy 4:2, 12:32; Psalm 12:6-7 and Proverbs 30:6 all declare to neither add nor subtract from God’s Word.*
- *Are we to suppose that Stephen is going to convert the Sanhedrin who have already crucified Christ and/or possibly save his own life by quoting to them from a verse that added five names to the Scriptures which they used in the synagogue every Sabbath? No small wonder they killed him! They would have looked on him as a perverter of Scripture. Such an act is not that which is recorded in the account.*

– *The Chronology of the Old Testament”, Dr Floyd Nolen Jones*

An Error?

- *“They slew Stephen for confronting them with the person of the Lord Jesus – that He was Christ indeed and, rather than receive Him as such, they had murdered Him as their father’s had done to His predecessors, the prophets (Acts 7:51-53)!”*
- *They were further enraged by Stephen’s call to repentance and his accusation that they had broken the Law, **Never** is there any suggestion that their rage resulted from consternation over Stephen’s having perverted the Scriptures.*

An Error?

- So we have to reject the scholarly explanation to this conundrum,
- But how then are we to reconcile this apparent discrepancy?
- *“Here is a straightforward example of scholars placing the Septuagint on a level equal to, yes – at times even above – the Hebrew text. But such recourse is totally unwarranted.*
- *All that is required is to begin with faith in God’s many promises that He would preserve His Word – Forever! Then careful prudent examination will expose that there is no real contradiction at all.*

The Seventy

- The seventy souls referred to in Genesis 46:26-27 (and Ex 1:5 / Deut10:22) we are clearly told was the 66 that travelled to Egypt with Jacob, Jacob himself, and Joseph with his two sons (Manasseh and Ephraim);
- $66 + 1 + 3 = 70$.
- All of these comprise “the house of Jacob” (Gen 46:27).

Dividing of the Nations

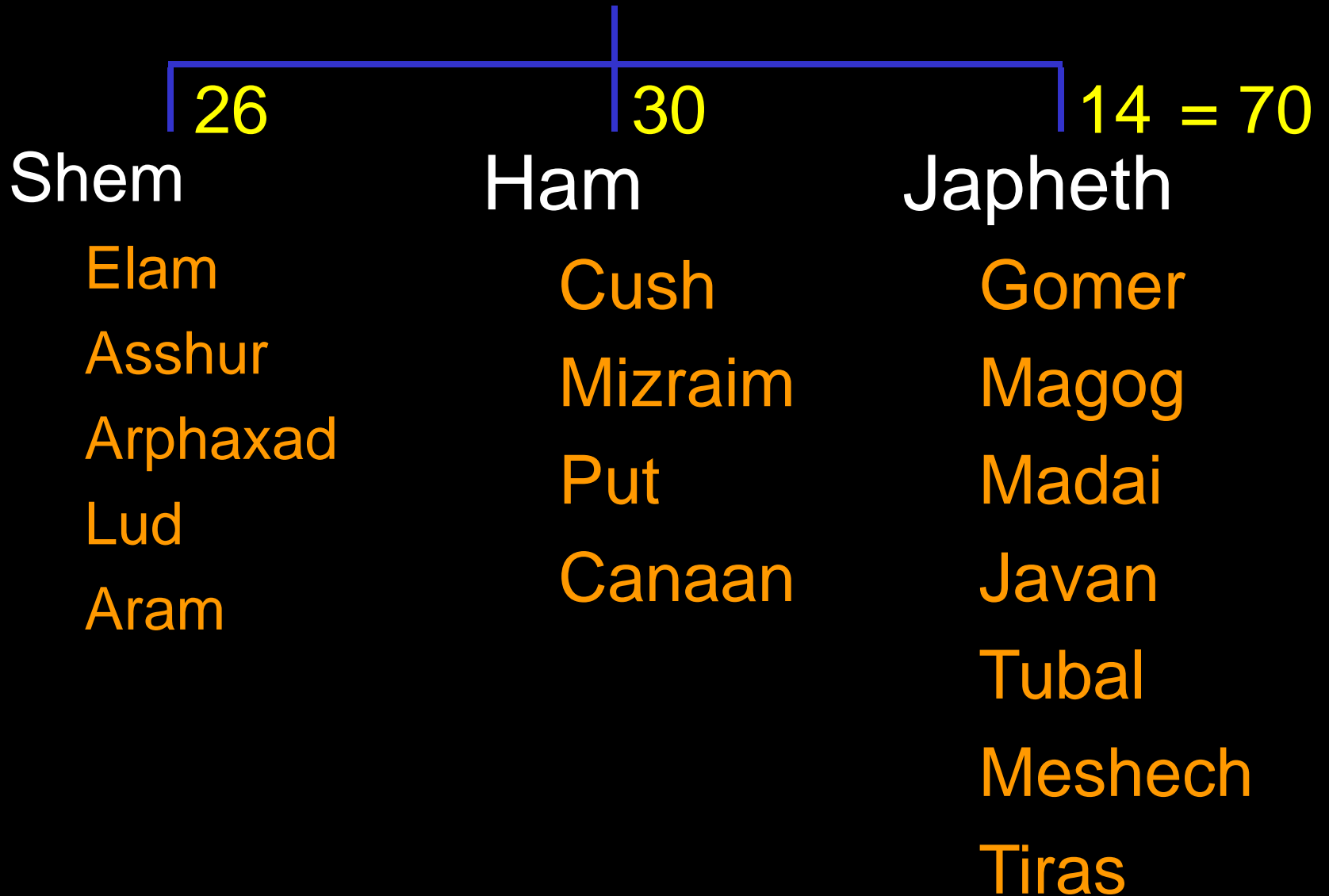
⁸When the most High divided to the nations their inheritance, when he separated the sons of Adam, he set the bounds of the people according to the number of the children of Israel.

The Seventy Five

- As to the “75”, Jones comments:
- *Stephen is neither mistaken nor is he citing from the LXX when he gives the number as 75. He is speaking of a different entity which he calls Jacob’s “kindred.” The terms “house of Jacob” and “kindred”, though similar, are not synonymous.*
- *As we have shown, the “house of Jacob” numbered 70, and it consisted of only Jacob as well as “his seed” – those who were said to have “come from his loins”.*

The Seventy Five

- As to the “75”, Jones comments:
- *However, Jacob’s “kindred” that Joseph “sent” for to come “to him” (Acts 7:14) are the 66 already cited plus the wives of his sons that come down to Egypt with their father.*
- *Moreover, in Genesis 46:26 we are given the clue that these wives are the key to differentiating between the “70” and the “75”.*
- *There we read that the 66 souls came with Jacob down to Egypt: “besides Jacob’s sons’ wives”.*

The Seventy Five

- As to the “75”, Jones comments:
- *These daughters-in-law were not included as having to do with the “house of Jacob” (Gen 46:26) which numbered only those “who came out of his loins”, but they are part of Jacob’s “kindred” that Joseph sent for.*
- *Now Jacob had 12 sons (Gen 35:22). To determine how many of their wives went down to Egypt, we simply take the 75 “kindred”, subtract the 66 who came from Jacob’s loins (as they are included in the “kindred”) and obtain 9 rather than 12.*

The Seventy Five

- As to the “75”, Jones comments:
- *That is, 9 of the 75 “kindred” that came to Egypt with Jacob did not come from his loins, and Gen 46:26 has already alerted us to the fact that they are the sons’ wives.*
- *Therefore, 3 of the 12 sons’ wives ($12 - 9 = 3$) were not numbered in the “kindred”.*

The Seventy Five

- As to the “75”, Jones comments:
- *Of course, we must immediately exclude Joseph’s wife for she was already in Egypt and thus was not “sent” for (Acts 7:14). This accounts for one of the three.*
- *A second is found earlier in Genesis 38:12 where we learn that Judah’s wife had died previously.*
- *Thus, one of the other sons must also have been a widower. We may deduce that it was almost certainly Simeon as special attention is called to the fact that Shaul, his youngest son, was by a Canaanitess (Gen 46:10).*

The Seventy Five

- In conclusion, Dr Jones states:
- *“Manifestly, the LXX that is today extant has been proven spurious, for Manasseh and Ephraim are far too young to be fathers when Joseph’s “kindred” went down to Egypt – much less grandfathers!*
- *The reading in the LXX is grossly untenable.*

The Seventy Five

- In conclusion, Dr Jones states:
- *Thus the “five missing names” in the Hebrew text at Genesis 46:20 (Machir, the son of Manasseh, Machir’s son Gilead, Ephraim’s two sons, Tahan and Shuthelah, along with his son Eran) are seen to have been interpolated by conjecture from Genesis 50:23 and Numbers 26:29, 35-36 (vv. 33, 39 and 40 in the LXX). The author of the LXX has tried to force Gen 46:20 to conform to Acts 7:14. This shows that the LXX in use today was not written BC, and its editor had a NT before him as he wrote.*

The Seventy Five

- In conclusion, Dr Jones states:
- *The painfully obvious conclusion before us is that - by not grasping the true explanation of the 66, 70 and 75 – the translator of the Septuagint tried to “correct” what he perceived as a “scribal error” in the Hebrew text.*
- *In so doing, he created one!*

Genesis 46

28 And he sent Judah before him unto Joseph, to direct his face unto Goshen; and they came into the land of Goshen.

29 And Joseph made ready his chariot, and went up to meet Israel his father, to Goshen, and presented himself unto him; and he fell on his neck, and wept on his neck a good while.

30 And Israel said unto Joseph, Now let me die, since I have seen thy face, because thou art yet alive.

- 31 And Joseph said unto his brethren, and unto his father's house, I will go up, and shew Pharaoh, and say unto him, My brethren, and my father's house, which were in the land of Canaan, are come unto me;

The Evil Years of Jacob?

- 70 years under the domination of Esau
- 20 years in Haran struggling with Laban
- 15 years in Shechem struggling with the men of the city and his son Reuben
 - 35+ years separated from his father
- 3 years in the Promised Land with Joseph struggling with his own sons
- 22 years of separation from Joseph

The Evil Years of Jacob?

- Jacob (heal catcher) is no doubt tired of providing from himself – taking a burden that was not his
- The Benefit of Resting in the provision of God – the place where we all should be
- David's advice to Solomon...

Instruction For Life

- ³ For I was my father's son, tender and only beloved in the sight of my mother.
- ⁴ He taught me also, and said unto me, Let thine heart retain my words: keep my commandments, and live.
- ⁵ Get wisdom, get understanding: forget it not; neither decline from the words of my mouth.
- ⁶ Forsake her not, and she shall preserve thee: love her, and she shall keep thee.

Instruction For Life

- ⁷ Wisdom is the principal thing; therefore get wisdom: and with all thy getting get understanding.

 - Jacob (Gen 50:13)



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
