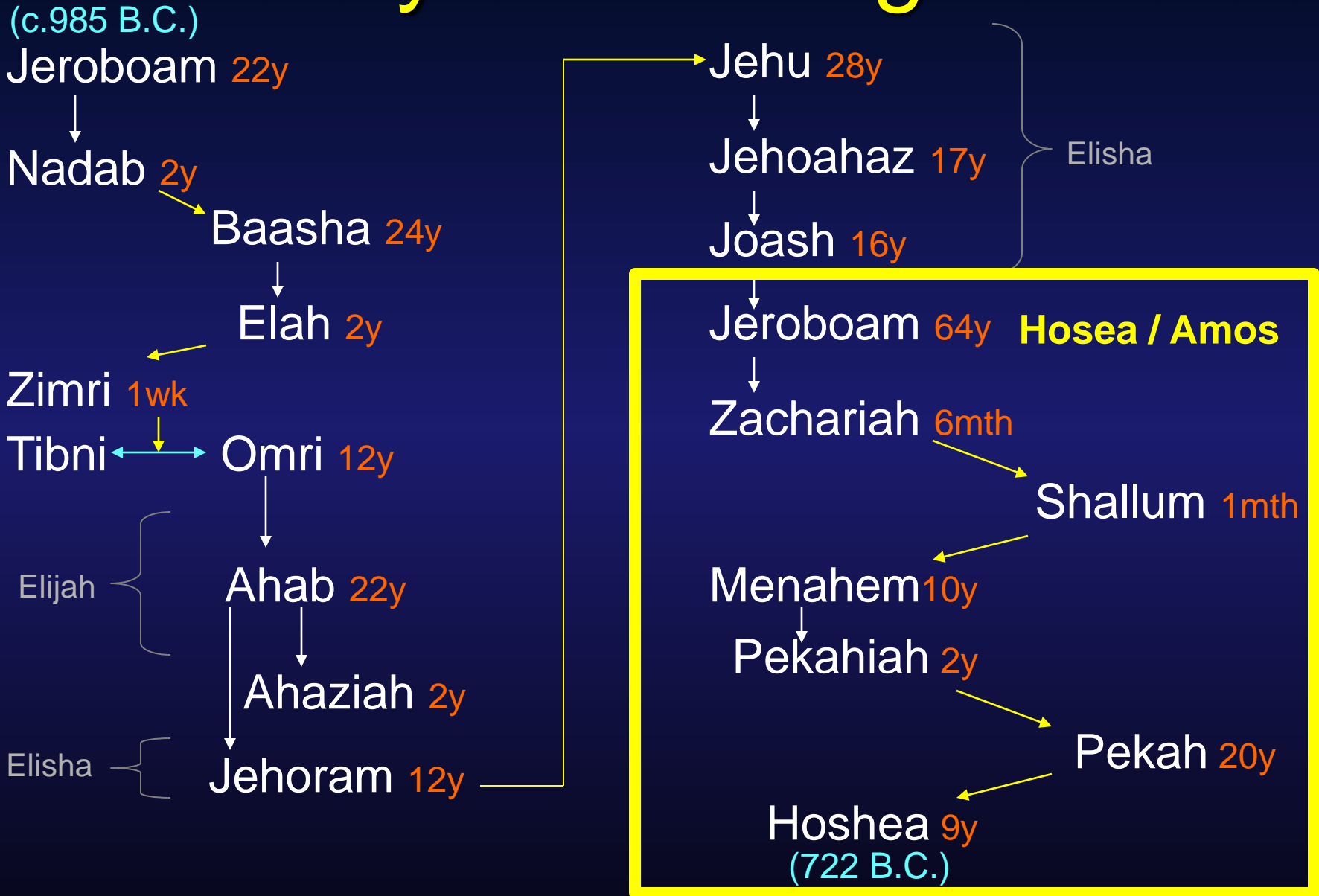

The Book of Hosea

Hosea

- The loving prophet
 - The Jeremiah of the North
- He is quoted more than 30 times in the New Testament, more than any other 'Minor Prophet'.
- *"In all the world's literature, there is no record of human love like that of Hosea."* George Robinson

Hosea

- *“We have in the Book of Hosea one of the most arresting revelations of the real nature of sin, and one of the clearest interpretations of the strength of the Divine love. Hosea

Hosea

- The golden age of Jeroboam II was passing and a dark cloud hung over Israel. On the death of Jeroboam, six kings followed in quick succession. Within 24 years 4 were assassinated.
- Mid way through Hosea's ministry a large part of the nation were carried away by the Assyrians. At the end of Hosea's life the kingdom of Israel came to an end with the fall of Samaria. Hosea lived to see some of his own prophecies fulfilled.

Hosea

- Hosea is told to marry '*a wife of whoredoms*'
- He marries Gomer and they have 3 children:
- Jezreel
 - God scatters / God sows
- Lo-ruhamah
 - No mercy
- Lo-ammi:
 - You are not my people

Hosea

- Key Verses:
 - 14:1 - "O Israel, return unto Jehovah thy God: for thou hast fallen by thy iniquity."
 - 14:4 - "I will heal their backsliding, I will love them freely..."
- Key Words:
 - "Return" used 15 times.
 - "Whoredom" used 16 times, referring not only to Israel's immorality, but also to her unfaithfulness to God.

Hosea

- Hosea's call & The rejection of Israel 1:1–9

- God's warning against Israel's unfaithfulness and judgment prophesied 2:2–13
- A future of blessing foretold for Israel 2:14–23

- God's controversy with his people Ch 4–10
- In wrath, God remembers mercy Ch 11–13
- Israel urged to repent & enjoy blessing Ch 14



The Book of Hosea

Chapter 1

The Call of Hosea

5 And it shall come to pass at that day, that I will break the bow of Israel in the valley of Jezreel.

Hosea 1:5

- The bow is a symbol of the covenant
- The covenant with Israel will be broken in the valley of Jezreel
 - Jezreel means to scatter
- From here Israel were scattered among the nations
 - First to Assyria, then global dispersal

Three Major Covenants

- **God's Covenant with Abraham** Gen 15
 - In his seed all nations shall be blessed
- **God's Covenant with Israel** Deut 28-31
 - If they faithfully served Him they'd prosper
 - If they forsook Him they would be punished
- **God's Covenant with David** 2 Sam 7
 - His family would produce the Messiah who would reign over God's people forever

Three Major Covenants


- God's Covenant with Abraham Gen 15
 - In his seed you shall be blessed
- God's Covenant with Israel Deut 28-31
 - If they faithfully obeyed they'd prosper
 - If they forsook him they would be punished
- God's Covenant with David 2 Sam 7
 - His family would be the Messiah who would reign over God's people forever

IO Yet the number of the children of Israel shall be as the sand of the sea, which cannot be measured nor numbered; and it shall come to pass, that in the place where it was said unto them, Ye are not my people, there it shall be said unto them, Ye are the sons of the living God.

II Then shall the children of Judah and the children of Israel **be gathered** together, and appoint themselves one head, and they shall come up out of the land: for great shall be the day of **Jezreel**.

- Jezreel also means to gather

Chapter 2

The Restoration of Israel

²³ And I will sow her unto me in the earth; and I will have mercy upon her that had not obtained mercy; and I will say to them which were not my people, Thou art my people; and they shall say, Thou art my God.

Hosea 2:23

- Though Israel had forfeited the Mosaic covenant blessings through disobedience...
- Yet Through God's faithfulness they will be restored
 - This is the part of scripture that Islam and Replacement theology has missed!

Chapter 3


The Restored Monarchy

4 For the children of Israel shall abide many days without a king, and without a prince, and without a sacrifice, and without an image, and without an ephod, and without teraphim:

5 Afterward shall the children of Israel return, and seek the LORD their God, and David their king; and shall fear the LORD and his goodness in the latter days.

Hosea 3:4-5

- The miracle is that Israel have abided!
- As with Job, David will be resurrected to rule over the house of Israel

Chapter 4

The Root of The Problem

⁶ My people are destroyed for **lack of knowledge:** because thou hast rejected knowledge, I will also reject thee, that thou shalt be no priest to me: seeing thou hast forgotten the law of thy God, I will also forget thy children.

Hosea 4:6

- A lack of knowledge led to the fall
 - Eve had not been properly taught & when challenged was uncertain ‘ye has God said...’
 - Do you know the promises & commandments of God



The Book of Hosea

Chapter 5

The Prerequisite for
the Return of Christ

¹⁵ I will go and return to my place, **till** they acknowledge their offence, and seek my face: in their affliction they will seek me early.

Hosea 5:15

- The key to understanding anti-Semitism
- Israel will finally see and petition Jesus their Messiah
 - This will coincide with the fullness of the Gentiles being gathered in
 - Occurs around Rev 16 after the last of the Gentiles are saved

Chapter 6

The Millennial Kingdom

¹ Come, and let us return unto the LORD: for he hath torn, and he will heal us; he hath smitten, and he will bind us up.

² After two days will he revive us: in the third day he will raise us up, and we shall live in his sight.

Hosea 6:1-2

- Are the days here literal 24 hour days?
 - Tim La Haye suggests yes
- How long will Israel live in His sight?
- 1000 years
- If the '3rd day' = 1000yrs, we must be approaching the end of the '2nd day' !


Chapter 8

Between Now & Then

8 Israel is swallowed up: now shall they be among the Gentiles as a vessel wherein is no pleasure.

Hosea 8:8

- This prophecy has been fulfilled in the most dramatic fashion
- Even Israel's allies are against her!


Chapter 10

The Vine of Israel

1 Israel is an empty vine, he bringeth forth fruit unto himself: according to the multitude of his fruit he hath increased the altars; according to the goodness of his land they have made goodly images.

Hosea 10:1

- Israel were to be a vine that brought refreshing & the knowledge of God to the world
- Satan countered this with 'The Vine of the Earth' **Rev 14:18-19** that began in Babylon
 - The purpose of which was to lead **AWAY** from God
- Jesus then comes as the True Vine **John 15:1**

- The 7 Feasts of Israel Leviticus 23

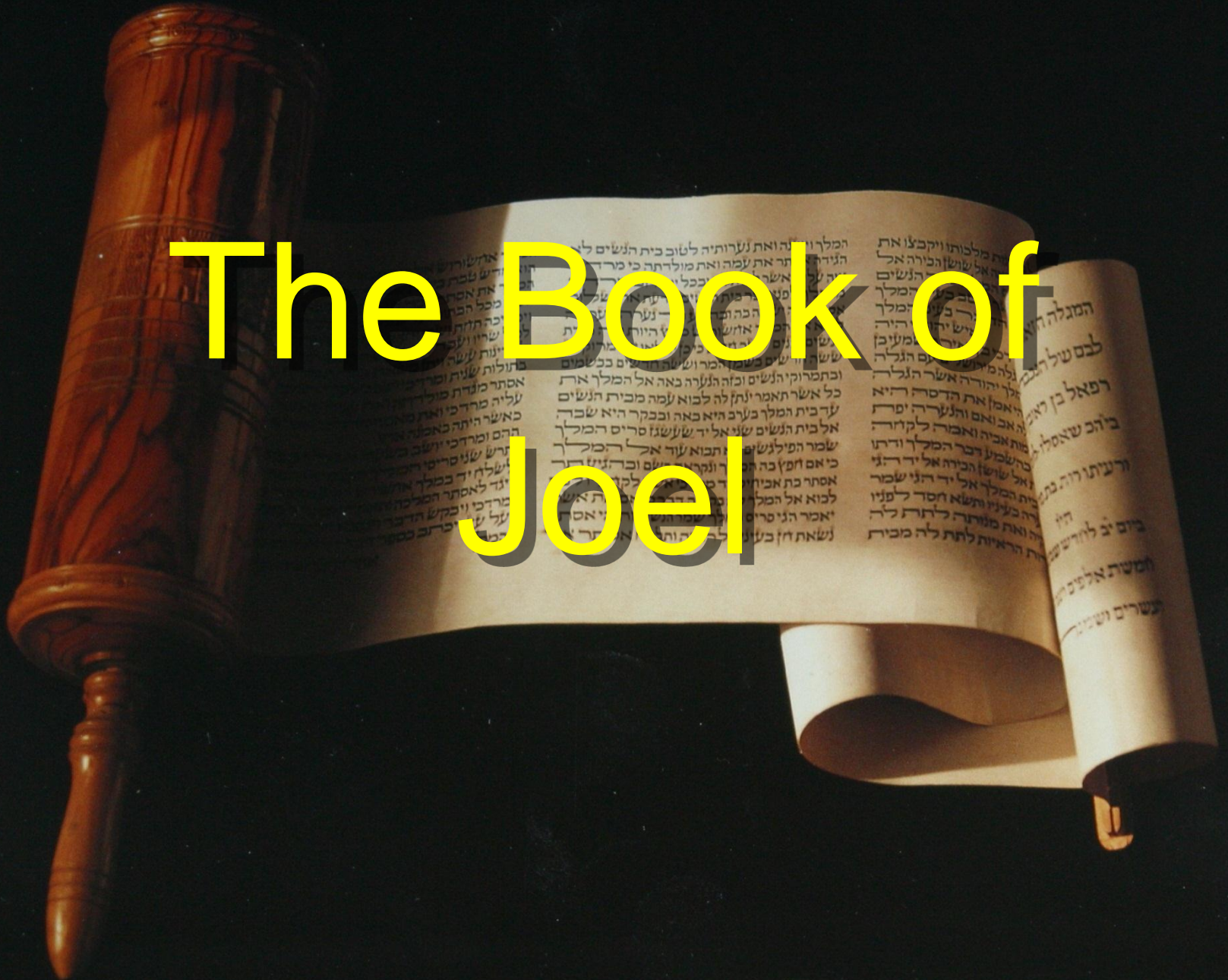

The Book of Joel



Joel

- Joel is introduced as the son of Pethuel.
 - Apart from that, little is known of him.
- His name means *Jehovah is God*.
 - He has been called the John the Baptist of the OT
- Key phrase of the book is “the Day of the Lord”
 - found five times (1:15; 2:1, 11, 31; 3:14).
- Earliest of the writing prophets?

Joel

- *“Joel, ... was probably the first of the so called writing prophets; so this book provides a valuable insight into the history of prophecy, particularly as it furnishes a framework for the end times which is faithfully followed by all subsequent Scripture. God started a new work with the writing of Joel, that of preparing the human race for the end of this temporal era, and thus gave an outline of His total plan. Later prophets, including even our Lord, would only flesh out this outline, but in keeping with the divine nature of true Scripture, never found it necessary to deviate from this, the initial revelation.”*

The Fall Feasts

Prophetic Fulfilment ?

- Trumpets – Joel 1:1-2:11 / Rev 8 & 9
 - A blowing of trumpets
 - Fire symbolizing judgment
- Atonement – Joel 2:12-2:32 / Rev 12
 - Repentance & reconciliation
 - Scapegoat flees to the wilderness
- Tabernacles – Joel 3:1-21 / Rev 16 & 19
 - The feast of ingathering
 - The dwelling together in unity

25 And I will restore to you the years that the locust hath eaten, the cankerworm, and the caterpillar, and the palmerworm, my great army which I sent among you.

26 And ye shall eat in plenty, and be satisfied, and praise the name of the LORD your God, that hath dealt wondrously with you: and my people shall never be ashamed.

27 And ye shall know that I am in the midst of Israel, and that I am the LORD your God, and none else: and my people shall never be ashamed.

28 And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh; and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions:

29 And also upon the servants and upon the handmaids in those days will I pour out my spirit.

30 And I will shew wonders in the heavens and in the earth, blood, and fire, and pillars of smoke.

31 The sun shall be turned into darkness, and the moon into blood, before the great and the terrible day of the LORD come.

The Road Map to Peace

¹ For, behold, in those days, and in that time, when I shall bring again the captivity of Judah and Jerusalem,
² I will also gather all nations, and will bring them down into the valley of Jehoshaphat, and will plead with them there for my people and for my heritage Israel, whom they have scattered among the nations, and parted my land.

The Book of Amos

The Shepherd-Prophet

Amos

- *“The book of Amos is written in some of the finest OT Hebrew style. Amos was a sheep-breeder and tender of sycamore trees. Perhaps he illustrates the appearance of God-ordained men throughout history who speak very effectively and even beautifully for the Lord without the traditional “school of the prophets” background or formal education so much sought after today.”*

Amos

- In his first two chapters, Amos pronounces judgment against eight nations.
- *“Each pronouncement of judgment is introduced by the words, “For three transgressions ... and for four.” Baxter explains this Hebrew idiom for us: The phrase is not to be taken arithmetically, to mean a literal three and then four, but idiomatically, as meaning that the measure was full, and more than full; the sin of these people had overreached itself; or, to put it in an allowable bit of modern slang, they had “gone one too many,” they had “tipped the scale.”*□

Amos

- Amos prophesies God's judgment on:
 - Damascus 1:3
 - Gaza 1:6
 - Tyre (Phoenicia) 1:9
 - Edom 1:11
 - Ammon 1:13
 - Moab 2:1
- And then Amos speaks of judgment on..
 - Judah! 2:4

1 1 The words of Amos, who was among the herdman of Tekoa, which he saw concerning Israel in the days of Uzziah king of Judah, and in the days of Jeroboam the son of Joash king of Israel, two years before the earthquake.

2 And he said, The LORD will roar from Zion, and utter his voice from Jerusalem; and the habitations of the shepherds shall mourn, and the top of Carmel shall wither.

Amos 1:1-8

- 3 Thus saith the LORD; For three transgressions of Damascus, and for four, I will not turn away the punishment thereof; because they have threshed Gilead with threshing instruments of iron:*
- 4 But I will send a fire into the house of Hazael, which shall devour the palaces of Ben-hadad.*
- 5 I will break also the bar of Damascus, and cut off the inhabitant from the plain of Azen, and him that holdeth the sceptre from the house of Eden: and the people of Syria shall go into captivity unto Kir, saith the LORD.*

⁶ Thus saith the LORD; For three transgressions of **Gaza**, and for four, I will not turn away the punishment thereof; because they carried away captive the whole captivity, to deliver them up to Edom:

⁷ **But I will send a fire on the wall of Gaza, which shall devour the palaces thereof:**

⁸ And I will cut off the inhabitant from Ashdod, and him that holdeth the sceptre from Ashkelon, and I will turn mine hand against Ekron: and the remnant of the Philistines shall perish, saith the Lord GOD.

- 3 Can two walk together, except they be agreed?*
- 4 Will a lion roar in the forest, when he hath no prey?*

Amos 3:3-4

*7 Surely the Lord GOD will do nothing, but he
revealeth his secret unto his servants the prophets.*

Amos 3:7

13 Behold, the days come, saith the LORD, that the plowman shall overtake the reaper, and the treader of grapes him that soweth seed; and the mountains shall drop sweet wine, and all the hills shall melt.

14 And I will bring again the captivity of my people of Israel, and they shall build the waste cities, and inhabit them; and they shall plant vineyards, and drink the wine thereof; they shall also make gardens, and eat the fruit of them.

15 And I will plant them upon their land, and they shall no more be pulled up out of their land which I have given them, saith the LORD thy God.

The Judgment of Edom

Obadiah

- 12 men in scripture with this name
- Obadiah means “Servant of Jehovah”
- Time of writing: soon after 587 B.C.
- Theme: the destruction of Edom
- Edom were the descendants of Esau
- They had continually been unkind to Israel
 - Even seizing the opportunity during the Babylonian destruction of Jerusalem to launch their own attack!

Obadiah
