Deliberate Design In the Scriptures

- God is outside of time and has revealed the future before it happens to serve as undeniable proof of His existence
- In the Bible God speaks through:
- 1) Direct specific prophecy
- 2) Types & shadows (anticipatory models)
- The details of 'Passion Week' were recorded over 1000 years before they took place...
  - ...through the Feasts of Israel,
  - ...the 'Messianic' Psalms
  - ...and through the Old Testament prophets

 In fulfillment of Gabriel's prophecy given to Daniel (ch9), Jesus presented Himself as the Messiah of Israel on the very day foretold over 500 years before!

Jesus rode into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday and allowed Himself to be worshipped as the Messiah
This was the <u>only</u> day in His ministry He allowed this, and He intentionally arranges the event
The Triumphal Entry was on the 10<sup>th</sup> of the month, the very day the sacrificial lamb's from the fields around Bethlehem were being taken and inspected, ready for sacrifice

- The Feast of Passover foreshadows Christ's sacrificial death
  - On the 14<sup>th</sup> day of the month (Nisan)
  - Jesus was able to both celebrate the Passover with His disciples & become the Passover Lamb, dying on the 14<sup>th</sup> because of Exodus 12:6
    - The lamb's must be killed 'Beyn' 'BETWEEN' the evenings – thus a 24 hour window
  - Paul states that Christ became our Passover 1 Corinthians 5:7

 The Feast of Unleavened Bread, His burial

 As Jesus body was placed in the tomb it became the 15<sup>th</sup> by the Jewish reckoning
 "Unless a corn of wheat fall into the ground and die, it abideth alone: but if it die, it bringeth forth much fruit" – John 12:24

 Summary So Far...
The Feast of Firstfruits, His resurrection

On the 17th Jesus rose from the dead on the Feast of Firstfruits
Thus becoming "the Firstfruits of all that slept" 1 Corinthians 15:20

- Paul contends that a specific historical event is the basis of Christianity
- If that event is not true, Christianity is not true!
- Christianity is not based on Christ's teaching, character, or the numerous miracles in His life...
- ...but on an event in a garden 2000y ago

Church history in plain language

"All but four of the major world religions are based on mere philosophical propositions. Of the four that are based on personalities rather than a philosophical system, only Christianity claims an empty tomb for it's founder. Abraham, the founder of Judaism, died about 1900 BC but no resurrection was ever claimed for him.

The original accounts of Buddha never ascribe to him any such thing as resurrection; in fact, in the earliest accounts of his death, we read that when Buddha died it was "with that utter passing away in which nothing whatever remains behind".

Mohammed died, June 8th 632AD at the age of 61, in the city of Medina where his tomb is visited annually by thousands of devout Muslims. All the millions of Jews, Muslims and Buddhists agree that their founders have never come up out of the dust of the earth in resurrection."

- This is not power for us to remit sins directly
- Only God through Christ can do that!
- This follows the giving of the Holy Spirit...
- "The disciples were to go out in the power of the Spirit to testify to the resurrection of Jesus. Any who would respond to the teaching of the disciples, their sins would be remitted. But those who rejected the gospel, their sins would be retained"

 This 'empowering' was to come <u>after</u> they had received the Holy Spirit <sup>8</sup> But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth.

**Acts 1:8** 

- Jesus focuses them on the task in hand:
- The purpose of the power and our mission is to be witnesses

### Purpose of the Power

<sup>12</sup> Verily, Verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father.
John 14:12

- Jesus does not say we will do greater miracles (Gr. Semeion = supernatural signs)
- But greater works
- Greater = Gr. meizon, in greater degree
- Works = Gr. ergon, toil (as an effort or occupation)
- What was Jesus' 'occupation' / 'work'?

"For the Father loveth the Son, and sheweth him all things that himself doeth: and he will shew him greater works than these, that ye may marvel" John 5:20

 This is the first time works (Gr. Ergon) are mentioned in John's gospel, and they are <u>from</u> the Father as a <u>witness</u> to the people.

"But I have greater witness than that of John: for the works which the Father hath given me to finish, the same works that I do, bear witness of me, that the Father hath sent me" John 5:36

• The works were not of Jesus but the Father, and were to be a <u>witness</u>.

"Jesus answered them, I told you, and ye believed not: the works that I do in my Father's name, they bear witness of me" John 10:25

 Here again, the purpose of the works is explained: they are of the Father, but the miracles Jesus did were to convince the people that He was the Son of God – God manifest in the flesh. Thus, works = witness.


"If I do not the works of my Father, believe me not. But if I do, though ye believe not me, believe the Works: that ye may know, and believe, that the Father is in me, and I in him". John 10:37-38

- Regardless of people's initial reaction to Him, Jesus points people to the works as the evidence He was God. Again, works = witness.
- What was the purpose of the works?
- To witness to the fact that Jesus was God

### **Pontius Pilate**



 "Important testimony of Pontius Pilate, recently discovered, being his official report to the Emperor Tiberius, concerning the crucifixion of Christ"

Justin Martyr, in his first apology for the Christians, which was presented to the Emperor Antoninus Pius, in the year A. D., 138, having mentioned the Crucifixion of Jesus and some of its attendant circumstances, says:

"And that these things were so done, you may know from the Acts made in the time of Pontius Pilate."

The learned Tertullian, in his Apology for Christianity, about the year 200, after speaking of our Savior's crucifixion and resurrection, and his appearance to the disciples, who were ordained by him to publish the Gospel over the world, thus proceeds:

"Of all these things relating to Christ, Pilate himself, in his conscience already a Christian, sent an account to Tiberius, then Emperor."

- It is Pilate's report to Emperor Caesar concerning the events of the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus
- He details:
  - What happened regarding the crucifixion
  - The kind of man Jesus was
  - That Jesus had been granted freedom to teach the people
  - That wealthy people didn't like Jesus on account of his support for the poor

- It is Pilate's report to Emperor Caesar concerning the events of the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus
- He details:
  - Miraculous events at the tomb of Jesus
    - That a brilliant light was seen
    - That an angelic being appeared
    - That there was an earthquake
    - That trained Roman guards collapsed in terror
    - And that they actually saw Jesus risen from the dead
    - But that they were then given money to keep quiet



- Sergius Paulus was the Roman-appointed 'deputy' [Gr: Proconsul] of Cyprus
  - Luke uses the word 'anthupatos'
- He was appointed in AD46 by Claudius
- His writings are quoted by Pliny (Roman Historian), meaning he must have been held in high regard
  - Luke states he was 'a prudent man' [Learned]
- See Acts 13:3-12

- Shortly after his conversion, Sergius Paulus was 'demoted' from Proconsul of Cyprus to looking after the river Tiber in Rome.
  - "To go from being the voice of Caesar, one of the top jobs of the empire, to being a comparatively minor civil servant responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of the city's riverbanks (removing rubbish and corpses), is some comedown, and it needs explaining!"
- Any Roman official would be required to observe pagan rituals and oaths

- Clearly a problem for a now-follower of Christ

- In addition, news of his conversion must have got out:
  - "Once Sergius Paulus had begun to speak as a Christian instead of as a Proconsul – the very voice of Caesar – it would have been realised by his peers in government as well as by Caesar himself" - Bill Cooper
- Yet having an exemplary record, Sergius Paulus was seemingly 'offered' a 'side-ways' move

- Yet Sergius Paulus' conversion did not just have an impact on Rome...
- It appears to have had a profound affect on the Apostle Paul himself.
- Until this moment, Paul had gone under his birth name – Saul of Tarsus.
- Now he 'adopted' the name of Paul
  - "It is almost unarguable that Sergius Paulus formally adopted Saul"

"The purpose of such adoption was to give the adoptee the protection, both in law and under arms, of the adoptor"
 Bill Cooper

- "This would, under God, have afforded Paul a level of protection against both Jew and Gentile which he otherwise would have lacked, and explains on a level which his mere Roman citizenship does not explain, why the Roman officials who dealt with Paul treated him so courteously..."
- "By Paul's day, Roman citizens were two-apenny, but the adopted sons of Rome's nobility were not"

- We have all this evidence...
- We can prove the Bible is God's Word
- We can demonstrate the resurrection is a fact
   of history
- We can show that there are no contradictions
- We can remove all barriers except one...
- The heart of the problem is the problem of the human heart!

### **Evangelistic Mandate**

 The world has seldom seen what God can do through a life yielded to Him.

• The evidence of a changed life, lived in holiness to the LORD is the greatest witness that can be offered.
