The Story So Far...

- God has created all things 'Very good'
- Lucifer (Anointed Cherub) given the highest position
 - To whom would the king delight to do honour more than to myself? (Esther 6:6)
- Then Adam is made in the image of God and given the charge over all creation!
- Satan furious seeks to destroy man
- God (in His mercy) promises a Saviour
 Kinsman Redeemer / "Seed of the woman"

The Story So Far...

- Satan launches a full scale attack against the Seed (who will it be?)
 - Abel?


– The 1st murder

- Satan launches 2nd assault
 - Satanic intrusion into the human race
 - Wickedness goes off the scale
 - God interviews to save humanity
 - Only Noah & his family remain genetically pure
- God sends the flood (to preserve humanity)

The Story So Far...

- After the flood, Satan launches a more subtle threefold stratagem:
- World Government
 - To manipulate mankind (against the Seed)
- False Religion
 - To deceive mankind (into following a false seed)
- 'Seek & Destroy' Plan
 - To annihilate the 'threat' of the real Seed
 - Satan has good intelligence and knows where to target

• The Call of Abraham?

^I Now the LORD bad said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee:

Genesis 12:1-3

And be said, Men, brethren, and fathers, bearken; The God of glory appeared unto our father Abraham, when he was in Mesopotamia, before be dwelt in Charran,

And said unto bim, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and come into the land which I shall shew thee.

Then came be out of the land of the Chaldaeans, and dwelt in Charran: and from thence, when his father was dead, he removed him into this land, wherein ye now dwell.



Abrahamic Covenant

And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing:
And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed.

Genesis 12:2-3

- All nations have been blessed through Abraham's offspring – the Seed
- God has (and still) blesses those who bless national Israel
- Throughout history, those who have 'cursed' Israel have themselves been 'cursed'
 - "You can chart the decline of the British Empire from the time it turned it's back on Israel"
- Matt 25 sees the dramatic conclusion of this prophecy to 'curse those who curse you' with the "judgment of the nations"

- God's "7 I Wills"
 - I will make of you a great nation
 - I will bless you
 - I will make your name great
 - I will make you a blessing
 - I will bless those who bless you
 - I will curse those who curse you
 - I will bless all the families of the earth through you

- Conditions of the covenant:
 - Get out of your country
 - Abraham doesn't do this immediately
 - Go to the land I will show you
 - Abraham doesn't do this either
 - Separate from your kindred
 - Not until Ch.13 does Abraham separate from Lot
- Abraham keeps building alters in the land
 - Every time he hears from God again...
 - Which is every time he remembers to obey!

- The separation of Lot
- Abraham's faith
 - Let God choose for you!

Lot's Steps

Beheld Chose Departed Dwelt in the plain Pitched...toward Dwelt in Sodom Seated in the gate (Coucilman)

The Battle of 9 Kings Genesis 14

Shemites Amraphel, king of Shinar Arioch, king of Ellasar Chedorlaomer, king of Elam Tidal, king of nations;

Hamites

Bera, king of Sodom Birsha, king of Gomorrah Shinab, king of Admah Shemeber, king of Zeboiim King of Bela (Zoar)

- Served Chedorlaomer 12 years; 13th year rebelled
- Chedorlaomer defeated and spoiled the rebels
- Took Lot, Abram's nephew, captive from Sodom

⁵ And in the fourteenth year came Chedorlaomer, and the kings that were with him, and smote the **Rephaims** in Ashteroth Karnaim, and the Zuzims in Ham, and the Emims in Shaveb Kiriathaim, ⁶ And the Horites in their mount Seir, unto El-paran, which is by the wilderness. 7 And they returned, and came to En-mishpat, which is Kadesh, and smote all the country of the Amalekites, and also the Amorites that dwelt in Hazezon-tamar.

Genesis 14 - The Battle of the Kings



- Abraham mobilises an army of 318 trained servants and goes after Lot
- When Abraham returns from the battle he is met by Melchizedek – the king of Salem
 - Jerusalem (located above the plain)
- Melchizedek brings bread and wine
 - The writer to the Hebrews explains:

Hebrews 7

^I For this Melchisedec, king of Salem, priest of the most high God, who met Abraham returning from the slaughter of the kings, and blessed him; ² To whom also Abraham gave a tenth part of all; first being by interpretation King of righteousness, and after that also King of Salem, which is, King of peace; ³ Without father, without mother, without descent, having neither beginning of days, nor end of life; but made like unto the Son of God; abideth a priest continually.

Heb 7:1-3

Hebrews 7

⁴ Now consider how great this man was, unto whom even the patriarch Abraham gave the tenth of the spoils. ⁵ And verily they that are of the sons of Levi, who receive the office of the priestbood, have a commandment to take tithes of the people according to the law, that is, of their brethren, though they come out of the loins of Abraham: ⁶ But he whose descent is not counted from them received tithes of Abraham, and blessed him that had the promises.


- The king of Sodom also comes out to meet Abraham
 - Sodom was at the lower part of the plain
- The king of Sodom offers Abraham gifts in exchange for the souls
- The king of above vs. The king of beneath
- The king of above brings blessing
- The king of beneath offers rewards that he might take the souls

Chapter 15

- The Unconditional Land Covenant
- Abram falls into a deep sleep
- God makes His declaration without Abram's participation

- Explained in Jeremiah 34:18-19

 God <u>alone</u> passes through the sacrifice 'barath' to cut a covenant



The Terms of the Covenant

- Declared eternal and unconditional
- Re-confirmed by an oath: Gen 22:15-18
- Confirmed to Isaac and to Jacob: Gen 26:2-5 (despite their acts of disobedience);
- NT declares it immutable: Heb 6:13-18

Boundaries of the Land

 Abraham was promised the land between the river of Egypt and the Euphrates,

Gen 15:18-21; cf. Deut 11:24

- The full extent of the land promised was never possessed
 - For a brief period during the reigns of David and Solomon, Israel held the land from the Euphrates to the Gaza strip, or from Dan to Beersheba 1 Kings 4:24–25
 - Nevertheless, the ideal of the promise was not lost sight of Ezek 47:15–20
- The promise to Abraham awaits fulfillment.

¹³ And be said unto Abram, Know of a surety that thy seed shall be a stranger in a land that is not theirs, and shall serve them; and they shall afflict them four bundred years;
¹⁴ And also that nation, whom they shall serve, will I judge: and afterward shall they come out with great substance.

Gen 15:13-14

• Chronology of the 400 years?

¹⁵ And thou shalt go to thy fathers in peace; thou shalt be buried in a good old age.
¹⁶ But in the fourth generation they shall come bither again: for the iniquity of the Amorites is not yet full.

Gen 15:15-16

"Iniquity of the Amorites not yet complete"?

- They need to sin a bit more before judgment?
- God is waiting for something
- The end of something is in sight:
 - the influx of the Nephilim would cease



United Nations Bias



- Of 865 Security Council resolutions passed before 1990:
 - 526 were directed against Israel 61%
- Of 690 General Assembly resolutions voted on before 1990:
 - 429 were directed against Israel. 62%
- During 5 wars against Israel
 No UN resolutions against the Arab Nation

United Nations Bias



- November 2003 Israel introduced it's first resolution since 1976.
- Israel requested that Arab terrorist not target Israeli women and children.
- It was rejected.
- The UN then adopted a resolution that demanded protection of Palestinian children from Israel!

Abrahamic Covenant (Part 3)

¹⁰ This is my covenant, which ye shall keep, between me and you and thy seed after thee; Every man child among you shall be circumcised.
 ¹¹ And ye shall circumcise the flesh of your foreskin; and it shall be a token of the covenant betwixt me and you.

Gen 17:10-11

Circumcision

- Vitamin K, clotting element, not formed until the 5th to the 7th day
- Prothrombin, also necessary
 - 3rd day: 30% of normal
 - –8th day: peaks at 110%, then levels off at 100% of normal
- How did Moses know to circumcise on the 8th day? Gen 17:1

¹⁵ And God said unto Abraham, As for Sarai thy wife, thou shalt not call ber name Sarai, but Sarah shall ber name be.
¹⁶ And I will bless ber, and give thee a son also of ber: yea, I will bless ber, and she shall be a mother of nations; kings of people shall be of ber.

Gen 17:15-16

¹⁷ Then Abraham fell upon his face, and laughed, and said in his heart, Shall a child be born unto him that is an hundred years old? and shall Sarah, that is ninety years old, bear?

 - Two angels (taken on physical form)
- God announces the birth of Isaac!
- The two angels head off to Sodom & Gomorrah
- God reveals His plan to destroy Sodom & Gomorrah because of their sin
- Abraham is concerned for Lot...





 Not before Lot's wife has 'looked back'
- Lot's daughters now without husbands and keen to preserve their father's line become pregnant by their father






Diagram illusustrating how excessive pressure caused by faulting resulted in ignition of oil, gas, sulphur and bitumen from the underlying oil field.

Chapter 22


- The greatest model in Scripture?



10 Camels – 'beasts of burden'

"A very thirsty camel-such as one just off a long, hot caravan-can gulp 35 gallons (135 I) of water in six minutes. One recordholding camel drank more than 50 gallons (200 l) in one day."





10 Camels – 'beasts of burden'

- Assume she can draw 10 liters every 5 mins
- Over 1 hour to water 1 camel!
- She would need to be drawing water for over 11 hours to water all camels!




The Model


- The Father sends a unnamed servant...

- The Bride tries to satisfy the beasts of burden, but eventually after leaving her old life, the beasts of burden bring her to the awaiting Bridegroom







- They offer a "Sign of a Covenant with God" to unbelievers
- Are they looking for Converts or Customers?

The Compromise of Dinah

- It began with Investigation
 - She "went out to see the daughters of the land"
 - This was not just a fleeting visit
 - Evidently she stayed for many days
- And ended with Humiliation
 - "He took her and lay with her, and defiled her"
- Followed by de-sensitisation

 She stayed *"in the camp of the Hivites"* until her brothers take her away



The Family of Esau



14 Dukes ('tribal chiefs) come from the immediate descendants of Esau

The Family of Esau

- Esau marries into the local power structure
- Some of his descendants become "chiefs"
- None of them become "kings"
- Close to power but never in power
- One more important "descendant of Esau" will show up...
- Herod the Great is an Edomite

The Legacy of Esau

¹⁴ Follow peace with all men, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord: 15 Looking diligently lest any man fail of the grace of God; lest any root of bitterness springing up trouble you, and thereby many be defiled; 16 Lest there be any fornicator, or profane person, as Esau, who for one morsel of meat sold bis birthright. ¹⁷ For ye know how that afterward, when he would have inherited the blessing, he was rejected: for be found no place of repentance, though be sought it carefully with tears. Heb 12:14-17

- Joseph his dreams & rejection
- Joseph is a type (model) of Christ in over 100 ways!

- After 35+ years Jacob returns to his promised possession
- It has been a hard time while he is gone
 Dealing with Laban
 Confronting Esau
- Jacob is now over 105 years old

- Many different opinions:

 - Coat of dyed in expensive colours
 - Coat representing authority (birthright?)
 - Long Coat with sleeves (Keil & Delitzsch)
 - A Seamless robe
 - Symbol of purity?

Joseph's Dreams

- The first dream was terrestrial (ruling on the earth?)
- The second dream is celestial (ruling in the heaven?)
- Jacob understood the meaning
- Idiom used in Revelation of Israel

Joseph Seeks His Brothers

- Sent by the father...
- They are in the land of Shechem
- Place of temptation and sin
- Whilst there, his life is taken by his brethren and he goes down into the pit

Chapter 38

- Judah's Trouble
- Judah marries a Canaanite and has 3 sons

⁷ And Er, Judah's firstborn, was wicked in the sight of the LORD; and the LORD slew him.
⁸ And Judah said unto Onan, Go in unto thy brother's wife, and marry her, and raise up seed to thy brother.

Gen 38:7-8

⁹ And Onan knew that the seed should not be bis; and it came to pass, when he went in unto his brother's wife, that he spilled it on the ground, lest that he should give seed to his brother.
¹⁰ And the thing which he did displeased the LORD: wherefore he slew him also.

The Helpless Brothers

The Intersession of Judah

- It demonstrates his love for his father
