Mark: Chapter 9

¹ And he said unto them, Verily I say unto you,
That there be some of them that stand here,
which shall not taste of death, till they have seen
the kingdom of God come with power.

Mark 9:1

- This is actually the conclusion of the previous section
- Things have been building to a crescendo

The story so far...

- Jesus has proven through the miracles that He is the Messiah
- Israel's leaders have rejected Him & constantly tried to find fault with Him
- Jesus declined the people's desire to crown Him their King
 - Because this was not God's plan
- Jesus then declines Gentile adulation
 - He could have gone to the Gentiles and been worshipped
- He doesn't deviate from His mission
- He has now revealed His plan to His disciples

The story so far...

- Who do men say I am?
- Who do you say I am?
- You can chose how to live...
- ...But if you want life you will have to die to self
- There is a new order of things coming, everything will be turned right way up again...
- You can gain the world temporarily, but lose all!
- OR you can be willing to lose all and gain eternity!
- Soon His Glory will be seen!

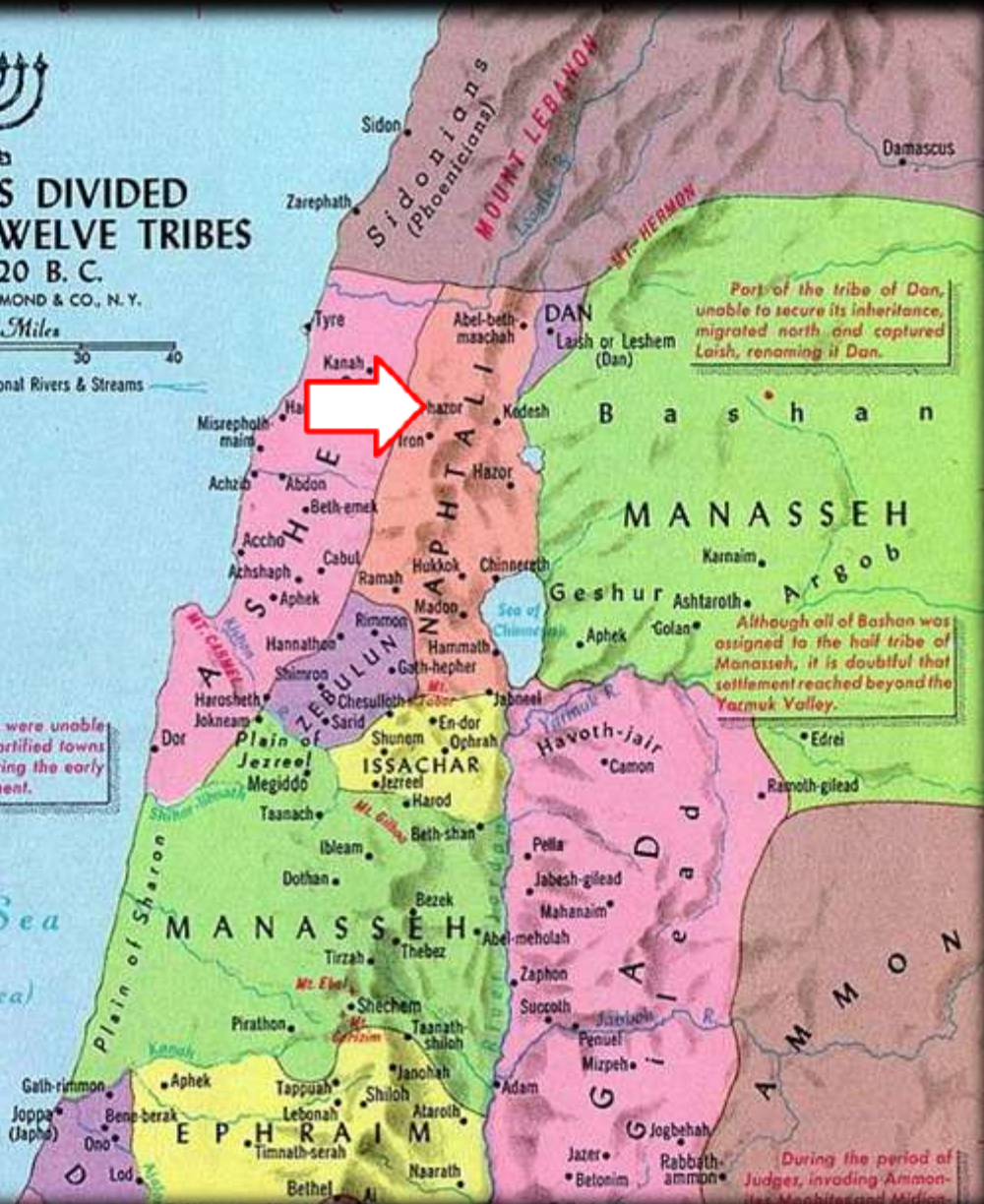
The Israelites were under constant attack from Philistines and Canaanites.

The Israelites were unable to capture the fortified towns of the plains during the early period of settlement.

Part of the tribe of Dan, unable to secure its inheritance, migrated north and captured Laish, renaming it Dan.

Although all of Bashan was assigned to the half tribe of Manasseh, it is doubtful that settlement reached beyond the Yarmuk Valley.

Mark 9:3-4

- Lit. Gr. 'metamorphoo' 'from the inside out'
 - We are body, soul and spirit
 - Our body is usually the visible part
 - We are essentially spiritual beings
- Our proximity to God will affect our appearance

Changed From Within

²⁹ And it came to pass, when Moses came down from mount Sinai with the two tables of testimony in Moses' hand, when he came down from the mount, that Moses wist not that the skin of his face shone while he talked with him.

Oswald Chambers

- We have no corresponding experience to the events in Our Lord's life after the Transfiguration. From then onwards Our Lord's life was altogether vicarious. Up to the time of the Transfiguration He had exhibited the normal perfect life of a man; from the Transfiguration onwards—Gethsemane, the Cross, the Resurrection—everything is unfamiliar to us. His Cross is the door by which every member of the human race can enter into the life of God; by His Resurrection He has the right to give eternal life to any man, and by His Ascension Our Lord enters heaven and keeps the door open for humanity.

Oswald Chambers

- On the Mount of Ascension the Transfiguration is completed. If Jesus had gone to heaven from the Mount of Transfiguration, He would have gone alone; He would have been nothing more to us than a glorious Figure. But He turned His back on the glory, and came down from the Mount to identify Himself with fallen humanity.
