- Psalm 119: "an utterance of spiritual life" Spurgeon
- It begins by stating the objective & goal of a follower of Christ; namely, to be conformed to His likeness
 - ...but then goes on to travel with us through life's journey, through the ups and downs, the moments of rejoicing and the times of failure and doubt.
- This Psalm comes from a heart that wants to see you be victorious, to truly walk by faith and not by sight.

- This Psalm is here to help you walk the walk, but not by giving you some well-worn clichés, patting you on the back and saying 'now, off you go!'
- Jesus said the Christian life should be a joyful experience; the 'burden' of following Him should not be heavy!
- But for many, we more readily identify with the struggle Paul speaks of in Romans 7.
- You know you want to 'live the life', but doing it is another thing!

- Every Psalm is special in its own way, but Psalm 119 stands out as a priceless gem just waiting to be picked up and cherished.
- It is the longest Psalm and considered the longest chapter in the Bible, but far from being laborious and repetitive, it is alive and full of vitality.

- This Psalm was intended to be memorised and used as an aid to learning.
- Whereas we have a simple rhyme to learn our alphabet, Hebrew children would learn their alphabet by memorising this Psalm.
- The first eight verses begin with the first letter of the Hebrew alphabet a 'Aleph'; the next eight verses with the second letter B 'Beth', and so on


- this is where we get the word 'Alpha-Bet'.

• God has intentionally designed this Psalm to be committed to memory.

 Bible commentator Matthew Henry said that his dad, Philip Henry, "advised us to take a verse of this Psalm every morning to meditate upon, and so go over the Psalm twice in the year; and that, saith he, will bring you to be in love with all the rest of the Scriptures." He often said, "All grace grows as love to the word of God grows."

- Charles Spurgeon comments that William Wilberforce, during a season of turmoil and political crisis, noted in 1819 in his Diary: "Walked from Hyde Park Corner repeating the 119th Psalm in great comfort".
- This Psalm really will do that; it will provide comfort during times of turmoil and crisis!

- There is a familiarity about this Psalm; it's as if you've been here before.
- It's like your favourite old armchair, it invites you to come and sit for a while and get things into perspective.

There are just 5 words in this verse in Hebrew.

- אֵינֵי Ayin eye, natural vision, the natural
- נְּלוּ Kala to be complete, be at an end
- לִישוּעָתֶד Yeshua salvation ('Jesus' in Hebrew)
- וּלְאָמְרַת Imra word, specifically the Word of God
 - גַרְקָד Sedeq righteousness
- We could paraphrase this as: "The natural comes to an end when we look at Jesus, the Word of God, our Righteous"

Law - הּוֹרָה *Torah*

- In the Hebrew this comes from a verb meaning to direct or to guide.
- This is principally what the Law does.
- It gives instruction for our protection and safety, to keep us from danger.

Testimonies - עֵדָה Edah

- Meaning to bear witness.
- This speaks of the things God has testified of, has born witness to as being true.
- God is outside time, and bears witness as to the right way.
- Because He can see the end from the beginning, He sees the end of every way we can choose, i.e. where it will lead to, so gives us the benefit of His wisdom.

Piqquwd פּקוּדִים - Piqquwd

- This comes from a word which means to place in trust.
- God has given us his truth and expects us to respect it.
- He has placed heavenly wisdom in trust with us we are custodians of this life-giving knowledge.
- This Hebrew word only occurs in this Psalm, and we find it here 21x
 - 3 x 7 three numerically speaks of Divine, seven denotes complete.
 - Thus, in this Psalm we have complete divine wisdom given to you and I, to act as custodians.

Statutes - הק Choq

- The verb from which this word is formed means to engrave or inscribe.
- The word means a definite, prescribed written law.
- Spurgeon says this means "that moral law of God which is engraven on the fleshly tables of the heart; the innermost and spiritual apprehension of His will".

- Ps 119:12 Blessed art thou, O LORD: teach me thy statutes.
- Ps 119:26 I have declared my ways, and thou heardest me: teach me thy statutes.
- Ps 119:33 Teach me, O LORD, the way of thy statutes; and I shall keep it unto the end.
- Ps 119:64 The earth, O LORD, is full of thy mercy: teach me thy statutes.
- Ps 119:66 Teach me good judgment and knowledge: for I have believed thy commandments.
- Ps 119:68 Thou art good, and doest good; teach me thy statutes.
- Ps 119:108 Accept, I beseech thee, the freewill offerings of my mouth, O LORD, and teach me thy judgments.
- Ps 119:124 Deal with thy servant according unto thy mercy, and teach me thy statutes.
- Ps 119:135 Make thy face to shine upon thy servant; and teach me thy statutes.
- Nine times in the psalm the psalmist cries 'teach me!', and eight of those it is God's statutes
 - that which is to be 'engraved on our hearts'
 - It is specifically that
 - he cries out for

Commandments - מְצְוָה *Mitsvah*

- From a verb meaning to command or ordain.
- Not only has God written His law on our hearts, He has actually commanded us to keep it.
- The Creator God does not sit passively by and let us fumble through life, making up our own rules.
- He has given definite instructions that we are obligated, as His creation, to obey.
- To refuse to obey is sin and stems from pride, choosing our own way over His as we see so tragically demonstrated in the Garden of Eden.

Judgments - אַשְׁפָּט *Mishpat*

- Signifying to govern, judge or determine.
- God as Judge of all has decreed, His subjects are duty bound (but not compelled) to follow.
- All His judgments are right and true.
- There is nothing unjust or tyrannical about God's judgments.
- All stem from a heart of Love.

Word - דְּבָר Dabar

- Connotatively (in a general sense) this embraces all of God's revelation to man, given for our learning and instruction, 'that the man of God may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing'.
- Denotatively, it has to do with specific utterances that come from the mouth of God.
 - When this occurs in the Psalm the context indicates the way it is being used.
- Either way it reveals a God who has condescend to speak to His creation!

Way - דֶרֶך (Dehrek)

- This word denotes a specific path we are encouraged and invited to follow
- A road trodden.
- It highlights that which Proverbs 16:25 tells us, that "there is a way which seems right to a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death".
- It also underlines that there is a way (singular) not a multitude of various options.
- There is only One Way to God through the death and shed blood of His Son.
- Jesus said that He was 'The Way', not 'a way'.

Biblical Numerology

- By numerology we mean the study of numbers and the way they are used in the Bible.
- Almost all occasions numbers are used in the Bible they have greater significance than just the surface application.
- We see this not just in the 'surface' numbers, but also the frequency of words used in a verse or passage

Genesis 1:1

7 words 28 Hebrew letters 28 = 4x7 (Earth + Complete)

- Purely out of curiosity, I decided to count the number of times the word 'Precepts' occurs.
- To my surprise (and delight), I found that it occurs 21 times.
- 21 is 3x7, the number 3 speaks of 'Divine' and 7, as we have noted, 'Complete'.
- It became immediately apparent that with God's Precepts, we have 'complete divine wisdom' – entrusted to you and me!

- Although I started counting in my English translation, I quickly realised I needed to look at the Hebrew.
 - The word for Precepts is פוּדִים Piqquwd.
 - Piqquwd also occurs 21 times in the Hebrew!
- But that made me wonder... How many times did the word 'Statues' occur?
- In Hebrew it is the word הזק Choq, and it also occurs 21 times!
- Now, that could be coincidental, but as the Rabbis say, coincidence is not a kosher word!

- I began to wonder if I was looking at Divine design in this most precious psalm?! So, I continued...
- The next word I went to was 'Judgments'. The Hebrew is ບອຸຫຼ່ Mishpat.
- Now, this actually occurs 23 times in the psalm, which is close, but not the 21 I was curiously by now expecting.
- So, I decided to look a little closer. Incredibly, on two occasions (v84 and v132) the word is used to speak of judgment (as in wrath / punishment) rather than a decree (i.e. as in passing a judgment, making a decision).

- That leaves exactly 21 occasions where this psalm specifically refers to God's Divine decrees – His Judgments!
- By now, three of the seven words used in the psalm as synonyms for the Word of God each occurred 21 times!
- This was now already showing purposeful design, far beyond chance.
- I then turned to 'Commandments', in the Hebrew, אַנָה Mitsvah.
- It occurs 21 times! Specifically, in the context of a personal obligation to God's ordinances.

- For Precepts, Statutes, Judgments and Commandments, they all occur 21 times each in this psalm.
- Again, 21 is 3 multiplied by 7,
- Divine and Complete!
- This psalm, that speaks of God's Word gives us a complete divine revelation of all we need to walk in the Way!
- But there is more!

- I found that דָה Edah, the Hebrew word for 'Testimonies' occurred 14 times!
- Why is that significant?
- Because 'Edah' means 'Witness'.
- The Biblical number for 'witness' is the number 2, and 7 denotes 'complete'.
- Thus, we have God's complete witness, given to us in His Word!
- That leaves us with two of the seven synonyms, Law and Word.

- The Hebrew for 'Law' will be familiar to many, it is the word הוֹרָה Torah.
- The name given to the first five books of the Bible.
- I found this occurs 25 times.
- 25 is the product of 5^2 , or 5x5.
- Five is Biblically used to denote Grace, Fullness or Completeness regarding man.
- But what connection does 'Grace' have to 'Law'?
- Are they not the antithesis of each other?

- Interestingly, 'Torah' comes from a Hebrew verb meaning 'to direct or guide'.
- Paul tells in Galatians 3:24 that 'the Law was our schoolmaster to bring us to Christ'!
- The Law 'confines all under sin' Gal 3:22.
- It directs and guides us and shows us we need a Saviour!
- Is that not Grace²?
- Jesus said to the Apostle Paul "My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness". 2 Cor 12:9

- Is that not what the Law does?
- By His Grace, God shows us our weakness though His Law that we might be saved!

- This left just 'Word' to consider, and in doing so I discovered something interesting.
- In Psalm 119 there are two Hebrew words the English translators have rendered 'word'.
- The first is זְּבֶר Dabar, which occurs 24 times.
- The other is מְרָה Imra, which is found 18 times.
- The first is the product of 3x8,
- the second, the product of 3x6.
- The Word is synonymous with Jesus:
- "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" John 1:1

- The number '3' represents 'Divine'.
- The number '8' carries the idea of 'new beginnings'
- The Apostle Paul declared: "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new" (2 Cor 5:17),
- and the writer to the Hebrews says that "Jesus [is] the mediator of the new covenant". (HEB 12:24)
- Jesus is the second Person of the Trinity, the Son of God, and our new beginning can only be found in the Living Word!

- 888 (three eights) is also the numerical value of Jesus' name in Greek!
- But Jesus is also God manifest in human flesh; the Divine (3), taking on the form of a man (6)!

 Every single one of the <u>seven</u> synonyms for the Word of God found in Psalm 119 occurs exactly the right number of times to convey an even deeper and greater truth and reveal a Divine design that can only be of God!

- There was one other word I was curious about. The Hebrew word is דֶּרֶדְ Dehrek and it's the word we have translated as 'Way'.
- It is the word this psalm is built on (c.f. verse 1),
- It occurs 8 times in the psalm, in the context of God's ways, as opposed to mine or the world's ways.
- Significantly, Christians, in the book of Acts were known as 'the Way' – in fact, eight times (yes! eight times), in the book of Acts, the Church is referred to by that name.

- As we've seen, '8' signifies 'new beginnings';
- Could there be a more fitting conclusion than the reminder that there is a new beginning for those who walk in the Way?

God's Revelation as seen in Psalm 119

- $LaW 25x = 5^{\times}5$ 'Grace²'
- God though His Grace has born witness and given a complete revelation of all we need to Walk in the Way.
 The Word became Flesh so that we can have a new beginning.
- Word (Imra) 18x = 3x6 'Divine/Man 'The Word became Flesh!'
 Way - 8x 'New Beginnings'

Walking in the Way

- An interesting exercise:
 - Jesus is The Way, so we can put the name of Jesus in each of these verses in place of the word 'way' as follows:
 - v1. Blessed are the undefiled in Jesus
 - v3. They also do no iniquity: they walk in Jesus.
 - v14. I have rejoiced in Jesus, as much as in all riches.
 - v27. Make me to understand Jesus: so shall I talk of thy wondrous works
 - v30. I have chosen Jesus [who is] truth
 - v32. I will run with Jesus [keeping] thy commandments.
 - v33. Teach me, O LORD, [of] Jesus, and I shall keep [Him] unto the end.
 - v37. Turn away my eyes from beholding vanity; and quicken me in Jesus.


Psalm 119 – A Personal Challenge!

- As a practical challenge, I encourage you to take just one verse of this Psalm each day (start today!), and meditate on it throughout that day.
 - 1. Start at breakfast,
 - 2. then remind yourself mid-morning of the verse.
 - 3. Then again at lunchtime,
 - 4. then in the afternoon,
 - 5. then as you sit to eat your evening meal,
 - 6. then in the evening,
 - 7. and finally when you go to bed
 - (see Psalm 119:164).
- The next day move onto the next verse.

Psalm 119 – A Personal Challenge!

- You will be amazed at what the Holy Spirit will show you, about your life, your walk, His goodness, His grace and patience, and the reality that He is able to make us stand! (Romans 14:4).
- If you do this and meditate on His Word each day, even just one verse, you will soon be surprised how the things of this world will grow strangely dim and lose their appeal, in the light of His glory and grace!





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
