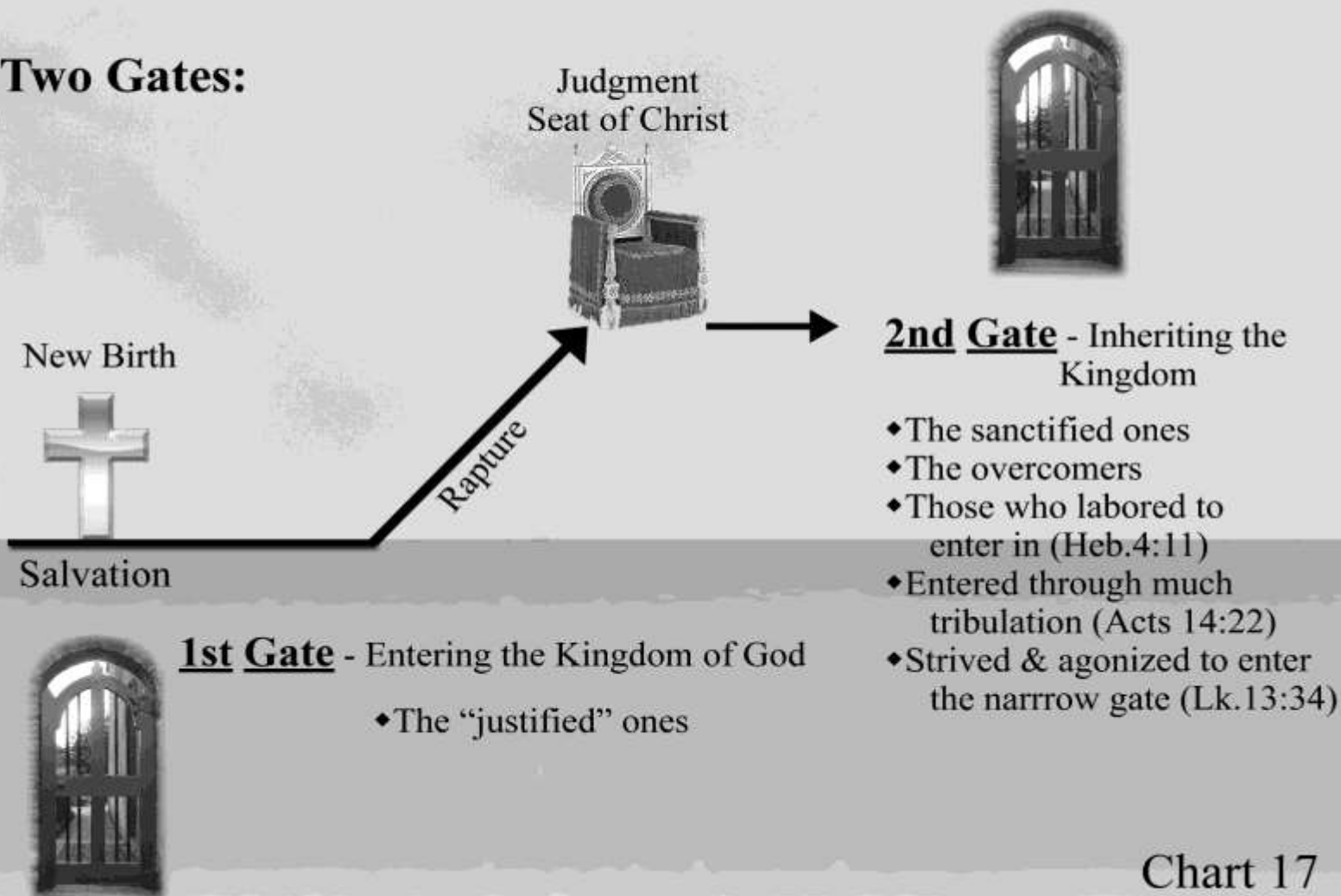

Child-like Faith

18 And a certain ruler asked him, saying, Good Master, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?

19 And Jesus said unto him, Why callest thou me good? none is good, save one, that is, God.

20 Thou knowest the commandments, Do not commit adultery, Do not kill, Do not steal, Do not bear false witness, Honour thy father and thy mother.

21 And he said, All these have I kept from my youth up.

Luke 18:18-21

- There are two Greek words for 'good':
 - Kalos (externally pleasing)
 - Agathos (intrinsically good)

Good Master

- *The ruler called him good teacher, using the word 'agathos'. Yeshua answered the ruler's question with a question of his own: "Why do you call me 'agathos' if only God is intrinsically good?"*
- *Yeshua declared himself to be the Messianic King; hence, He claimed to be intrinsically good.*
- *Now the question was: does this ruler agree or disagree? The ruler should have responded, "I call you good because you are God".*
- *Had he answered Yeshua that way, he would have answered his own question, for the one thing he had to do to receive eternal life was to accept Him as the Messianic God-Man. However, the ruler remained silent.*

22 Now when Jesus heard these things, he said unto him, Yet lackest thou one thing: sell all that thou hast, and distribute unto the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, follow me.

Luke 18:22

- **Jesus told him to do 3 things:**
 - 1) First, he should 'sell everything' and get rid of his wealth to show his love for God, since that kept him from trusting God
 - 2) Second, 'give to the poor', to show love for his neighbour.
 - 3) Third, 'come follow me', to show he accepted Yeshua as the Messiah

23 And when he heard this, he was very sorrowful: for he was very rich.

24 And when Jesus saw that he was very sorrowful, he said, How hardly shall they that have riches enter into the kingdom of God!

25 For it is easier for a camel to go through a needle's eye, than for a rich man to enter into the kingdom of God.

Luke 18:23-25

- Contrast this man's reluctance to humble himself and trust Jesus to the child-like faith Jesus had just spoken about!

26 And they that heard it said, Who then can be saved?

27 And he said, The things which are impossible with men are possible with God.

Luke 18:26-27

- You are not saved because of wealth, riches, position, knowledge or ability...
- You can only be saved by humbly accepting Jesus' atoning work in your place!
 - With God it is possible!

28 Then Peter said, Lo, we have left all, and followed thee.

29 And he said unto them, Verily I say unto you, There is no man that hath left house, or parents, or brethren, or wife, or children, for the kingdom of God's sake,

30 Who shall not receive manifold more in this present time, and in the world to come life everlasting.

Luke 18:28-30

- This is a promise from Jesus!
- Do you believe it?
- Q. What could prevent it?
- A. Unbelief!

31 Then he took unto him the twelve, and said unto them, Behold, we go up to Jerusalem, and all things that are written by the prophets concerning the Son of man shall be accomplished.

32 For he shall be delivered unto the Gentiles, and shall be mocked, and spitefully entreated, and spitted on:

33 And they shall scourge him, and put him to death: and the third day he shall rise again.

34 And they understood none of these things: and this saying was hid from them, neither knew they the things which were spoken.

43 And immediately he received his sight, and followed him, glorifying God: and all the people, when they saw it, gave praise unto God.
