- What is it the you resort to in difficult times?

#### What we *must* do!

"But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you." (Matthew 6:33)

Immediately we look at these words of Jesus, we find them the most revolutionary statement human ears ever listened to. "Seek ye first the kingdom of God." We argue in exactly the opposite way, even the most spiritually-minded of us – "But I *must* live; I *must* make so much money; I *must* be clothed; I *must* be fed."

#### What we *must* do!

The great concern of our lives is not the kingdom of God, but how we are to fit ourselves to live. Jesus reverses the order: Get rightly related to God first, maintain that as the great care of your life, and never put the concern of your care on the other things.."


- <sup>9</sup> Thus God hath taken away the cattle of your father, and given them to me.

- 19 And Laban went to shear his sheep: and Rachel had stolen the images that were her father's.



### Inheritance

 So, Rachel and Leah were wrong to look to their father Laban for their portion or inheritance once they were married to Jacob. He now was their portion and inheritance. - <sup>20</sup> And Jacob stole away unawares to Laban the Syrian, in that he told him not that he fled.

# Being On The Lord's Side!

When a man's ways please the LORD, he maketh even his enemies to be at peace with him.

**Proverbs 16:7** 

- Then Laban overtook Jacob. Now Jacob had pitched his tent in the mount: and Laban with his brethren pitched in the mount of Gilead.
- <sup>26</sup> And Laban said to Jacob, What hast thou done, that thou hast stolen away unawares to me, and carried away my daughters, as captives taken with the sword?

Genesis 31:25-26

- Rachel & Leah had happily gone with Jacob
- They were more like captives with Laban!
- The world thinks we are entering bondage when we leave it to follow after God

- Wherefore didst thou flee away secretly, and steal away from me; and didst not tell me, that I might have sent thee away with mirth, and with songs, with tabret, and with harp?
- <sup>28</sup> And hast not suffered me to kiss my sons and my daughters? thou hast now done foolishly in so doing.

Genesis 31:27-28

- Laban says they should have had a leaving party!
- Not likely!
- The world hates to lose face!
  - Much easier to blame those following God!

<sup>29</sup> It is in the power of my hand to do you hurt: but the God of your father spake unto me yesternight, saying, Take thou heed that thou speak not to Jacob either good or bad.

**Genesis 31:29** 

- It was no more in 'the power of Laban's hand' to hurt Jacob than to turn the day to night!
- Laban just want's to pretend he's in control!
  - The is the nature of persecution!
    - Can you remember the persecutors?
    - Did they manage to extinguish the light?

- And now, though thou wouldest needs be gone, because thou sore longedst after thy father's house, yet wherefore hast thou stolen my gods?
- And Jacob answered and said to Laban, Because I was afraid: for I said, Peradventure thou wouldest take by force thy daughters from me.

Genesis 31:30-31

- Notice something interesting here?
- Jacob genuinely cared for <u>both</u> daughters

- With whomsoever thou findest thy gods, let him not live: before our brethren discern thou what is thine with me, and take it to thee. For Jacob knew not that Rachel had stolen them.
- And Laban went into Jacob's tent, and into Leah's tent, and into the two maidservants' tents; but he found them not. Then went he out of Leah's tent, and entered into Rachel's tent.

Genesis 31:32-33

- Now Rachel had taken the images, and put them in the camel's furniture, and sat upon them. And Laban searched all the tent, but found them not.
- <sup>35</sup> And she said to her father, Let it not displease my lord that I cannot rise up before thee; for the custom of women is upon me. And he searched, but found not the images.

Genesis 31:34-35

- <sup>36</sup> And Jacob was wroth, and chode with Laban: and Jacob answered and said to Laban, What is my trespass? what is my sin, that thou hast so hotly pursued after me?
- Whereas thou hast searched all my stuff, what hast thou found of all thy household stuff? set it here before my brethren and thy brethren, that they may judge betwixt us both.

**Genesis 31:36-37** 

- This twenty years have I been with thee; thy ewes and thy she goats have not cast their young, and the rams of thy flock have I not eaten.
- That which was torn of beasts I brought not unto thee; I bare the loss of it; of my hand didst thou require it, whether stolen by day, or stolen by night.
- <sup>40</sup> Thus I was; in the day the drought consumed me, and the frost by night; and my sleep departed from mine eyes.

Genesis 31:38-40

- Thus have I been twenty years in thy house; I served thee fourteen years for thy two daughters, and six years for thy cattle: and thou hast changed my wages ten times.
- 42 Except the God of my father, the God of Abraham, and the fear of Isaac, had been with me, surely thou hadst sent me away now empty. God hath seen mine affliction and the labour of my hands, and rebuked thee yesternight.

**Genesis 31:41-42** 

43 And Laban answered and said unto Jacob, These daughters are my daughters, and these children are my children, and these cattle are my cattle, and all that thou seest is mine: and what can I do this day unto these my daughters, or unto their children which they have born?

**Genesis 31:43** 

- This is as close as Laban gets to an apology!
  - and it's not a very good one!

- 44 Now therefore come thou, let us make a covenant, I and thou; and let it be for a witness between me and thee.
- <sup>45</sup> And Jacob took a stone, and set it up for a pillar.
- 46 And Jacob said unto his brethren, Gather stones; and they took stones, and made an heap: and they did eat there upon the heap.
- <sup>47</sup> And Laban called it Jegar-sahadutha: but Jacob called it Galeed.

Genesis 31:44-47

- 48 And Laban said, This heap is a witness between me and thee this day. Therefore was the name of it called Galeed;
- <sup>49</sup> And Mizpah; for he said, The LORD watch between me and thee, when we are absent one from another.
- <sup>50</sup> If thou shalt afflict my daughters, or if thou shalt take other wives beside my daughters, no man is with us; see, God is witness betwixt me and thee.

**Genesis 31:48-50** 

- And Laban said to Jacob, Behold this heap, and behold this pillar, which I have cast betwixt me and thee;

  This heap be witness, and this pillar be witness, that
- This heap be witness, and this pillar be witness, that I will not pass over this heap to thee, and that thou shalt not pass over this heap and this pillar unto me, for harm.
- The God of Abraham, and the God of Nahor, the God of their father, judge betwixt us. And Jacob sware by the fear of his father Isaac.

**Genesis 31:51-53** 

- Then Jacob offered sacrifice upon the mount, and called his brethren to eat bread: and they did eat bread, and tarried all night in the mount.
- <sup>55</sup> And early in the morning Laban rose up, and kissed his sons and his daughters, and blessed them: and Laban departed, and returned unto his place.

Genesis 31:54-55

- This is an act of worship by Jacob.
- From here he could survey the promised land
- He was now free from danger and home!
