  - His final appointment was drawing near.

Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine.

2 Timothy 4:2

- Instant = diligent. (Or better, urgent.)
- Paul doesn't say "preach from the Word."
  - Sometimes a "text is a pretext that's taken out of context."
- Reprove = with conviction.
- Rebuke = actually, threaten.
- Exhort = comfort . . .

## And they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables.

2 Timothy 4:4
